- ART. 9. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for the repair of roads and bridges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 10. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for repair of State Aid road for the ensuing year.
- ART. 11. To see if the plantation will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the plantation to State aid, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- ART. 12. To see if the plantation will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$300 for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the plantation is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- ART. 13. To see if the plantation will vote to raise \$500 to install chemical toilets at the schoolhouse as provided by the school laws.
- Art. 14. To see if the plantation will vote to exempt the taxes on a proposed mill to be built by A. L. Savage.
- ART. 15. To see how much money the plantation will vote to pay outstanding bills.

The Assessors give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the school-house at 12.30 in the afternoon, on the day of said meeting.

# Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the S. S. Committee and Citizens of Coplin:

In accordance with the provisions of the school law I herewith submit to you my annual report for the fiscal year ending Feb. 1, 1923.

Since the last report our school has had no interruptions and steady progress has been made by the pupils. Last year we began following the plan presented in the State Course of Study and I find at the present time that all the grades are doing the work expected of them at this time in the year. This is following the plan laid out for every school in the district and it means that every pupil is approximately at the same place in each study at the same time in the year. In case of changing from one school to another the pupil neither has to be put back or rushed ahead to fit his grade.

During the past year the text-books in Language, Arithmetic, Spelling and Reading have been changed so that now we are very well

equipped in that line.

It was not planned at the time of the last report to make any repairs on the building but in the summer the board decided that the schoolhouse needed painting badly and as no repair money was raised last year we have a small overdraft in that account.

In the High school account the overdraft shown is mostly due to the fact that the High school money had not come from the State when the books were closed. However, we should increase our appropriation to \$100.00 under this head to take care of the tuition and overdraft from last year.

Under supplies we had an old bill of \$21.00 to pay this year which accounts for the most of the money used in that column.
